## OVERVIEW

A quilt is a large piece of fabric that consists of various "patches" or squares. Each part of the quilt has a different pattern that connects to an overall design. After reading your independent novel, create a "quilt" to display the various topics and skills covered in your book. The final product should be a visual representation of the key details of your text. Each "patch" will contain a different topic or skill from your text, which will be combined to make a "book quilt".

## REQUIREMENTS

- 9 squares in the quilt should:
- Have a skill label (character / setting / conflict, etc)
- Be fully designed to represent a portion of the novel
- Include information listed within the categories below


## REQUIRED SKILL SQUARES Complete ALL of the following:

Character Picture: IMAGE

- Add main characters' names
- Draw the character

Conflict Analysis

- What was the main conflict/issue in the text?
- How was the conflict resolved?

Text Topics: IMAGE

- Determine 5 or more BIG ideas of the text
- Add these topics inside a relevant symbol/object

Character Overview

- Write a 1 sentence gist of who each character is
- Add character traits

Iitle \& Author: IMAGE

- Write the text title and author's full name
- Design the square to be a new "book cover"


## Theme of the Story

- What lesson was learned?
- HOW is this lesson created in the text?


## Setting: IMAGE

- Sketch the text's overall setting
- Add text evidence and a citation!


## Favorite Line/Passage:

- Show us your favorite line!
- Explain examples of Author's Style Techniques


## Favorite Moment: IMAGE

- Pick your favorite scene to draw
- Add a caption of what the scene is about
